#### WORSHIPPING THROUGH MUSIC, ART, AND DRAMA

Our liturgical journey continues in May and June. Easter, which lasts for 50 days, continues early in the month and then we turn to the culmination of our faith journey which began with Advent.

The Feast of the Ascension of Jesus Christ (May 29, 2022), also called Ascension Day or Ascension Thursday commemorates the Christian belief of the bodily Ascension of Jesus into heaven. It is one of the ecumenical (i.e., universally celebrated) feasts of Christian churches, ranking with the feasts of the Passion, of Easter, and Pentecost. Following the account of Acts 1:3 that the risen Jesus appeared for 40 days prior to his Ascension, Ascension Day is traditionally celebrated on a Thursday, the fortieth day of Easter; although some Christian denominations have moved the observance to the following Sunday.

Pentecost (June 5, 2022) for Christians culminates the celebration and work of the church begun on Easter Day. In much of early Christianity, Easter Day (not Pentecost) became the primary day for baptisms. After their baptism, the newly baptized were then trained in basic Christian doctrine, including the meaning of the sacraments they had now experienced, as they prepared to take up their ministries in the life of the church. On Pentecost, Christians primarily celebrate the commissioning of new members into ministry. Some do this through services of confirmation on Pentecost. And still others have also, historically, offered baptism on Pentecost as well.

**Trinity Sunday (June 12, 2022)** is the first Sunday after Pentecost in the Western Christian liturgical calendar, and the Sunday of Pentecost in Eastern Christianity. Trinity Sunday celebrates the Christian doctrine of the Trinity, the three Persons of God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The Season after Pentecost (Sundays after Pentecost) is the time of the church year to support new disciples and the whole congregation in living out the gifts we have been given in the name of Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit.

Throughout the summer, we will continue to offer worship in person and online and our "Summer Hymn Sing" will return before worship.

I want to THANK members of the Worship & Arts Committee, the Chancel Choir, Jubilation Ringers, the Drama Troupe, and our guests for being a part of our Holy Week and Easter celebrations! After three years of not being together for these most holy of days, your dedication ensured that the people who worshipped with us in person and online truly were able to proclaim: "Hosanna to the Son of David," "Love one another as I have loved you," "It is finished," and "Alleluia! Christ is Risen."

We're going to slow down during the summer months, but we will not stop! We will highlight members of our ministry throughout the summer, so you will not want to miss a single Sunday.

#### LAKESIDE PRESBYTERIAN CENTER FOR CHILDREN

As COVID restrictions start to loosen through the country, the Children's Center has returned to some normalcy. Parents are dropping off their children in the school building. In-person family events are occurring outdoors for each class. Children and staff are able to remove their masks indoors and outdoors. We are excited, as they are small glimmers of hope of what's to come in the summer and the 2022-2023 school year.

During the months of March and April, the Children's Center was busy with different activities. Women's History Month, Community Helpers Week, St. Patrick's Day and Holi were celebrated in the month of March.
