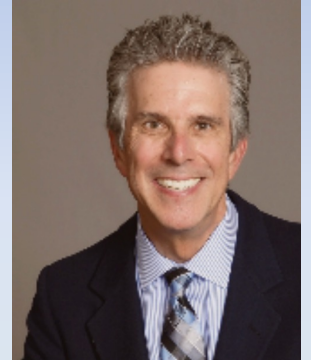

It was the day after Christmas at a church in San Francisco. Pastor Mike was looking at the nativity scene outside when he noticed the baby Jesus was missing from the figures.

Immediately, Pastor Mike turned towards the church to call the police. But as he was about to do so, he saw little Jimmy with a red wagon, and in the wagon was the figure of the little infant, Jesus.

Pastor Mike walked up to Jimmy and said, "Well, Jimmy, where did you get the little infant?" Jimmy replied, "I got him from the church."

"And why did you take him?"

With a sheepish smile, Jimmy said, "Well, about a week before Christmas I prayed to little Lord Jesus. I told him if he would bring me a red wagon for Christmas, I would give him a ride around the block in it."

I hope this story brought a smile to your face.

We are entering the season where we get to celebrate two incredible events; one, Thanksgiving, and second, Christmas. The first one, we, like the pilgrims acknowledge that God provides all that we need. The pilgrims celebrated their first harvest in the New World in October 1621. This feast lasted three days and was attended by 90 Wampanoag Native American people and 53 Pilgrims. They had much to be grateful to God for and so do we.

The second is Christmas Day when we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, incarnate Lord to Mary and Joseph in Bethlehem. Who celebrated the birth of Jesus? Cattle, sheep, and other farm animals, and of course, shepherds.

I want to point out two things both Thanksgiving and Christmas have in common—first is God, and second, God is to be celebrated. We have come a long way since the first wave of COVID19. Churches are open, people are working, people are moving around freely, and, hopefully, the worst of the pandemic is behind us. This is something to celebrate and give thanks to God.

I want to focus on Christmas with the rest of this article, asking the question, “How Do We Get into the Holiday Spirit?” Here are a few suggestions:

1. Put up an Advent calendar to count down to Christmas.
2. Turn up the Christmas music to get you in a festive mood.
3. Watch classic Christmas movies to learn the meaning of Christmas.
4. Read Christmas stories with your family to enjoy quality time with each other (The Grinch, Scrooge, It's a Wonderful Life, Miracle on 34th Street, and The Nativity Story to name a few).
5. Visit outdoor displays of Christmas lights and decorations.
6. Reflect on the reason for Christmas. Find the Christmas story in Luke chapters 1 and 2 and Matthew chapters 1 and 2. Consider reading these chapters aloud as part of your family's holiday.

My prayer for all of us is that we will be overwhelmed by God's grace, love and goodness in both Thanksgiving and Christmas. Let us give thanks to God for all His wonderful gifts.

WORSHIPPING THROUGH MUSIC, ART, AND DRAMA



November and December, more than any other two months of the year, represent endings and beginnings. In the liturgical calendar, November 1 is set aside as **All Saints' Day**—the day that the church honors the dearly departed in the faith. At Lakeside, during the first Sunday following November 1, we honor and remember those who have died over the course of the last twelve months.

This year, November 20, is the last Sunday in the Christian calendar. On this day we celebrate **Christ the King** as king and ruler of all. It also happens to be the Sunday before Thanksgiving, so LPC has the tradition of worshipping in celebration of Christ and in thanksgiving for the world that God has given us.

"Since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so, worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our 'God is a consuming fire.'"

And then we begin again! You can see from the image above that with **Advent**, we wait in expectation of the birth of our Savior, but that is only the first step in our journey to the cross. For the next 20 weeks, we wait in expectation; we celebrate in joy of the newborn child; we experience the arrival of the Magi; we remember our baptism; we are transformed; we are reminded that we are mere specks of dust; we marvel in the triumphal entry; we gather around Christ's table; we sit and pray at the foot of the cross; and we finally witness the joy of the resurrection. Advent is the beginning of an amazing journey for all Christians, and you are invited to join us in person or online for every minute of it.

Make sure to join us on **Sunday, December 11, 4 pm** for our **Christmas Carol Concert and Sing-along** in the sanctuary featuring our Sanctuary quartet. Afterwards, join us in the Fireside Room for a Christmas party with pastries and desserts prepared by the Chancel Choir and others.

Finally, join all of us for our **Christmas Eve** service on Saturday evening **December 24, 9 pm** (with music for brass, organ, handbells, and choir) and our **Christmas Day** service on Sunday morning **December 25, 11 am** (with music for choir and organ) in the sanctuary as we celebrate the birth of the Savior. These services will also be streamed on our website and Facebook Live.

JUBILATE CHOIR IS BACK!

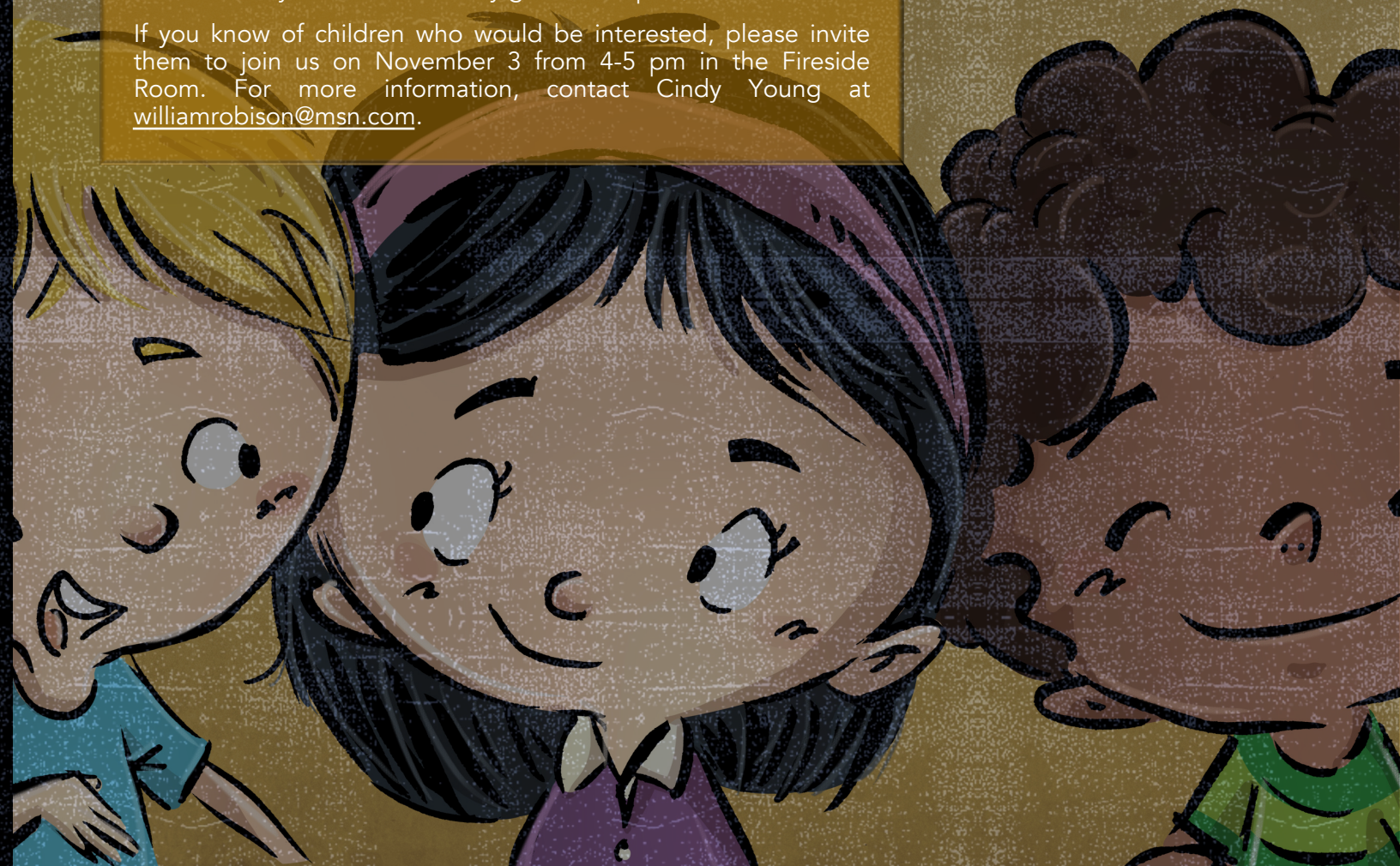
Exciting news! On Thursday, November 3, Lakeside's children's choir, Jubilate, is coming back! After closing in March of 2020 due to Covid there have been several years where it was not wise to mix children from various schools for singing. Meanwhile, our wonderful Jubilate singers grew-up and aged out of the program.

So, Jubilate is beginning anew, focusing on T-K/Kindergarten through Second Grade this year. Children's choirs are a wonderful way to learn how to work together in a group, to sing (and speak) in healthy ways for their bodies, to learn about music in general and making music and explore responsibility at a young child's level. Being a church choir, Jubilate is also a special place to learn about our faith, our traditions, and experience God's love in new ways. It's music with a message that the children learn to share with the congregation and throughout their lives. Aretha Franklin, Bono, John Legend, and John Lennon, among so many accomplished singers, began in children's church choirs (and John Legend and Andrew Lloyd Weber became church choir directors, too.)

Jubilate is open to boys and girls of all faiths (or none) as a ministry of our church, and no previous church nor singing experience is required. The choir does participate in the worship service several times a year (about once a month), and children who join the choir will be expected to come on those Sundays.

Jubilate is also a wonderful way for Lakeside Children's Center friends to stay in-touch after they graduate—plus, it's free!

LAKESIDE PRESBYTERIAN CENTER FOR CHILDREN

The Children's Center has settled into the school year. October marks the first month of in-person parent volunteering. Parents have been in the classrooms, supporting the teachers and staff with activities and projects. On October 7th, the school went on its first field trip since 2019 to Lemos Farm Pumpkin Patch. 90 students, their parents and many of their siblings (Lakeside alum included) boarded yellow school buses to Half Moon Bay. Thank you to the PVO board and the volunteers for putting together a wonderful event!

Also in October, the Firefly class hosted its class family potluck. The family potlucks were a hit last year, as part of the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Committee. Families gather to share a special recipe and dish with the class during the children's lunch time. At the end of the month, the school hosted its annual Halloween parade in the yard. The children made costumes in the classrooms, paraded around the yard and sang a couple Halloween songs for their family, friends and loved ones. The children were dressed up as pumpkins (Caterpillars), characters from the film *Coco* (Ladybugs), hippies (Butterflies) and trees (Fireflies). Thank you to the PVO board for generously donating the materials and supplies for the children's Halloween costumes.

November and December are busy months at the school. In November, the Firefly and Butterfly classes will host their annual conferences. The Firefly class will also host its annual Open House to discuss the registration and enrollment process for the 2023-2024 school year. The Butterfly class will host their family potluck on Friday, November 11th. On Tuesday, November 22nd, the classes will come together to put on the annual Thanksgiving Feast. Santa will be coming to town in early December and a modified version of the Christmas program will make its return on Friday, December 16th, with the Caterpillars and Ladybugs performing at 9am and the Butterflies and Fireflies performing at 10am in the Social Hall. We are looking forward to wrapping up 2022 on a high note with many in-person family events and are excited for the second half of the school year in 2023!
