From the Pastor's Desk

1 Corinthians 15 is a chapter in the Bible that all Christians should read in preparation for Holy Week. 1 Corinthians 15:1-8 reminds us of the Good News of Jesus Christ:

> "Let me now remind you, dear brothers and sisters, of the Good News I preached to you before. You welcomed it then, and you still stand firm in it. It is this Good News that saves you if you continue to believe the message I told you—unless, of course, you believed something that was never true in the first place.

> I passed on to you what was most important and what had also been passed on to me. Christ died for our sins, just as the Scriptures said. He was buried, and he was raised from the dead on the third day, just as the Scriptures said. He was seen by Peter and then by the Twelve. After that, he was seen by more than 500 followers at one time, most who are still alive, through some have died. Then he was seen by James and later by all the apostles. Last of all, as though I had been born at the wrong time, I also saw him."

> Paul reminds us in this passage of what Holy Week is all about. What encourages me is when Paul says, "The Good News about Jesus Christ will save us if we continue to believe it and faithfully follow it."

How does the Jesus' resurrection become the Good News of Jesus Christ that saves us?

- 1. Because Christ rose from the dead, as he promised, we know that what he said is true and that he is God.
- 2. Because he rose, we have certainty that our sins are forgiven.
- 3. Because he rose, he lives and represents us before God.
- 4. Because he rose and defeated death, we know we also will be raised and have eternal life.

Easter Sunday is the pinnacle of our faith in the resurrection of our Savior and Lord Jesus Christ. The following story reminds us of this great event. "I am Zordak, Jesus' guardian angel. I want to tell you the story of Jesus. Jesus had died and laid in the grave. I was very sad. There were one hundred Roman soldiers and whole army of evil angels guarding the grave. But Sunday morning is coming...It was still dark. The dew was still on the ground. It was now close to sunrise, and everyone was waiting for something to happen. Suddenly, there was a great flash of lightening straight from the throne of God. One of God's mighty angels appeared. The angel's glory shown brighter than the sun. The Roman soldiers laid on the ground like dead men. Even the evil angels scattered. The angel pointed his sword at the stone. With a flash of force, the rock rolled away as though it was a small pebble. The mighty angel called out in a loud voice: "Son of God, Ruler of the Universe, Jesus of Nazareth, come out." We all held our breath. The universe held their breath. All of heaven was watching the mouth of the cave. The ground was shaking as a great energy and light emulated from the tomb. The light was so intense that even the mighty angel that stands at the throne of God himself had to step back. Jesus was reclaiming his power as the creator of this world. Jesus walked out of the tomb. We lowered our swords, kneeled, and bow to our King. And all of heaven worshipped Jesus for He had conquered death. We all sang: "Praise God, the King of kings, the Lord of lords. The Creator of the universe. The Savior of the world. The Conqueror of death." Jesus has gone back to heaven. He is waiting for you. When the time comes, he will come back and take us all to heaven to live with him. Jesus says: "I love you very much... I want you to be in heaven with me forever and ever." We have prepared a great party for you. God has even written a very special song just for you. I'm going to be there, and I want every one of you to be there too.

May we all rejoice with the angels that Jesus Christ has risen from the dead. Christ has risen indeed, and as a result we will one day be at the party to worship and celebrate our King.



BUILDING AND GROUNDS REPORT

We have been busy with work at the church. In January a GFI plug was replaced in the Social Hall. This supplied power to the audio system and the womens' bathroom. Two new furnaces that supply heat to the Social Hall and a classroom were installed. The fire protection for the church was recertified in January. Still to be addressed is a leak in the Tower. We know where it is on the inside but need to determine whether it is a patch or complete repair by inspection on the outside. Some additional electrical needs to be done at the breaker box in the downstairs hallway by the furnace room. In addition, bids are being reviewed for painting and window replacement.
