

November is a tender time for the transgender community since this is the month when we remember all those who have been (and there is no easy way to say this) murdered purely for being their authentic selves. It is heartbreaking and we here, at Lakeside, want to show a time of love and hope for our transgender siblings. We will be holding a time of space in the chapel on Friday, November 17 at 7pm. Come join us and invite your friends and let's be in community together.



November and December are very busy months in the life of our worshipping congregation. From remembering those Saints who have left this earthly life to the celebration of the birth of our Savior, there are many opportunities to worship together, and you are invited.

November 5, 11 a.m.

Beginning on the first Sunday of the month, the church gathers to remember those Saints who have died since we gathered last year. Lakeside shares a beautiful communion service where we stop and toll a bell in honor of those lives. This year, we're adding a tradition that comes from our hispanic siblings in the honoring of all of our deceased relatives. You are invited to bring a framed image of anyone in your life to church on November 5 and place them on our Table of Remembrance that will be setup in the Narthex with candles and flowers, so that we might all remember and give thanks.

November 12, 11 a.m.

Our community gathers for worship to hear and reflect on the gospel narrative of Matthew 25:1-13 "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know the day or the hour." The Chancel Choir will present Fridrich Zipp's setting of "Wake, awake for night is flying."

November 19, 11 a.m.

Our own Jubilation Ringers with organ, will present "This is Our Creator's World" by renowned handbell composer Linda McKechnie, and our Chancel Choir will sing "Sing to the Lord of Harvest" as we prepare to give thanks during our annual Thanksgiving luncheon immediately following worship.

November 26, 11 a.m.

On the last day of the church year, we celebrate "Christ the King," that day of the church where we honor Christ and remember all that Jesus has done for us. The Chancel Choir will sing Henry Purcell's hauntingly beautiful "O God, Thou Art My God" which concludes with the hymn "Christ is Made the Sure Foundation."

December 3, 11 a.m.

On the first Sunday in December, we begin Advent, the season of expectation. This year the Chancel Choir will present a Lessons and Carols for Advent as we read scriptures, sing anthems, and sing hymns which prepare us for the birth of our redemption.

December 10, 11 a.m.

On the second Sunday in December, Advent II, our Jubilation Ringers with flute present "Comfort, Comfort You My People," a dance like setting of this engaging Advent hymn. The Chancel Choir will sing a beautiful Renaissance motet, "Jerusalem Surge" by Heinrich Isaac.

December 17, 11 a.m.

The third Sunday in Advent is where we light the pink candle indicating that the birth of our Savior is getting closer. The Chancel Choir will present Mark Sirrett's "Thou Shalt Know Him When He Comes" based on a poem by an unknown author.

December 24 morning, 11 a.m.

This year, Advent IV occurs on the morning of December 24 and so we will present a Lessons and Carols for Christmas featuring the beloved story of our sin, through the prophets foretelling of the birth of the Messiah, to the the announcement of the birth of Jesus, with readings, anthems, and carols celebrating the season.

December 24 evening, 9 p.m.

And finally, our candlelight Christmas Eve service, which opens with the introit, "Hodie, Christus Natus Est" (Today, Christ is Born.) We process into the church singing "O Come, All Ye Faithful" with congregation, choir, brass, timpani, and organ, and our service continues through scriptures, psalm, sermon, and concludes with communion and the lighting of our Christmas Candles.

O Come let us adore Him, Christ the Lord.


RAMBLIN' RECIPES

Important – As this is written, we've entered **Lakeside's Stewardship month.** During this month, you will be asked to pledge for 2024 your financial support of our Lakeside Church. Your pledges are important; they let plan our expenditures for the upcoming year.

Financial Status - Despite this being written for the November-December Lantern, the Session hasn't had a chance to approve the September financial reports, so this information is only through the end of August 2023.

Member giving continues to be less than projected, by about \$7,000. This is important because we must withdraw money from our limited reserves if our income is insufficient to meet our obligations. Unfortunately, income from renting our facilities is down by about \$4,000. All told, our income was about \$11,000 less than we expected. Not good.

Pastor Chris's departure in April has reduced pastoral expenses by -\$18,000. Committee expenses, year-to-date, are slightly higher than planned. Utility expenses have overrun by \$2,900 so far this year, the biggest culprit being trash pickup.

As a result of expenses being more than we planned and income being less, through the end of August, we're worse off than we expected - down \$50,184, while planning to be down (only) \$44,583. This is not good.

We still expect to overrun this year and your continued generosity as well as a close watch on expenses will minimize that overrun.

BUILDING & GROUNDS REPORT



A lot has progressed since the last Lantern issue. The painting has moved forward smoothly and will probably be finished by the end of October. Hurray!

The odor of gas was detected in early October. The Children's Center wisely called P.G.&E and found that the stove in the downstairs kitchen was leaking gas. They also found that the supply line to one of the furnaces that heats the sanctuary had a small leak. As a result, the stove gas supply was shut off.

Because the leak in at the furnace was so small, it was left on because there was adequate venting taking place. The stove has been repaired and is working fine. After inspection by the furnace technician, it was determined that the line including the supply valve needs to be replaced.

After doing that, the technician found that a motor in the furnace itself was not functioning. He said that he could replace the motor but due to the age of the furnace (30 plus years) and the cost of the motor, more thought should be given to replacing it. The Session approved a cost cap of \$5,000. The cost of the new furnace is just below the cap at \$4,635.

All the lights in the chancel have been replaced. So now the choir and other groups have good lighting for the music.

The electrical work that needs to be done in the Children's Center area has been scheduled for the period between December 18th and the end of the year. This period when the Center is on Christmas break allows the work to be less disruptive to all.
