

NEXT STEPS FOR LAKESIDE:

WHAT WILL HAPPEN AFTER PASTOR CHRIS' RETIREMENT?

When Pastor Chris Gelini informed us in February of his decision to leave Lakeside to pursue a new calling, we began a new journey – to find new pastoral leadership.

Some concerned members and friends have asked what will happen next. This is an attempt to answer that question by summarizing, very generally, the **Call Process**.

Following Pastor Chris's departure, Lakeside will be served, temporarily, by "Pulpit Supply." This is a group of ordained Presbyterian ministers, or other qualified persons, who are listed with the Presbytery as available to churches to preach, moderate session meetings and provide other services on a temporary basis. This could continue for a period of weeks or possibly a few months. This is arranged by Presbytery which will work with Lakeside's Session through Presbytery's Committee on Ministry ("COM") and its liaison, an ordained

minister who will serve in an advisory role to Session.

During this temporary period, with the Presbytery's approval, the congregation will elect a Pastor Nominating Committee ("PNC") of approximately a half-dozen members of the church.

This committee will be responsible, working closely with the Presbytery liaison from COM, for identifying, and proposing for vote of the congregation, candidates for installed, or in some cases, temporary pastoral relationships.

Concurrently with search activities, the church will engage in a process of discernment – of where it is, where it is going, what is its community; and what is its ministry and mission. This is often referred to as a "Mission Study". It is usually prepared by another committee of Session or by the PNC. The precise nature of, and need for, the discernment process will be determined by consultation between the Presbytery and the church.

Another important task of the PNC is to complete the Ministry Information Form ("MIF") and present it to Session and Presbytery for approval.

Likewise, the PNC members will receive, read, and evaluate Personal Information Forms ("PIFs") of pastoral candidates. They will acquaint themselves with the applicants, narrow the field, and interview the "short list" of candidates. The PNC will negotiate the terms of call and other appropriate issues, and report regularly to the congregation on the pastoral search process.

The congregation has a number of important responsibilities. These include: electing the PNC and praying for it; electing the new pastor nominated by the PNC; approving the terms of call; and welcoming the new pastor as the ministry begins.



The call process could last between one to two years, possibly more. A reasonable estimate would include three months of initial pulpit supply; six to eighteen months of service by an interim pastor; and three to six months of completion of the call to a "permanent" called pastor.

For those interested in a more detailed description of the call process, the Presbyterian Church (USA) has many resources. One of the best is "On Calling a Pastor," prepared by the Church Leadership Connection, and published in March, 2015. It can be accessed online by searching Google for On Calling a Pastor – Presbyterian Church (USA) and following the links. (The manual is 51 pages in length.)

Every effort will be made to keep the congregation informed of progress as it happens. Please keep Session and PNC in your prayers that their efforts will result in a new pastor who can help revitalize Lakeside and lead our church in new pathways consistent with our Mission.

Lakeside celebrated its annual Holi event with the children outside, welcoming the start of Spring.




